4. Housing

- (1) On-campus dormitory: double room, and multiple rooms (downhill): USD 400-800 / semester (4.5 months)
- (2) i-House 5 mins walking distance from the NCCU campus (single room or double room): USD 1,300-1,800 / semester (4.5 months)
- (3) Outside-campus accommodation: around USD300-600 / month / suite

5. Courses

- (3) On-line course enrollment: the details will be announced by email in late August (Fall)/ late January (Spring)

5. Orientation:

We will have orientation one week before the semester starts. Exact date will be announced to students when it is approaching. The orientation is compulsory.

- Orientation dates for 2018 Fall: September 3rd 2018 (master) / September 6th 2018 (bachelor)
- Orientation date for 2019 Spring: February 20nd 2019 (for both master and bachelor students)

6. Visa:

(1) Staying less than 180 days (For student who will stay for one semester):

- ♦ Visa Free
- If you are from the following countries and plan to visit other countries within 90 or 30 days, **you** don't have to apply for a visa but just enter Taiwan with your passport. That means, you could enjoy another 90 or 30 days visa free every time when you enter Taiwan and please do make sure your passport is valid for at least 6 months while the Japanese passport should be valid for at least 3 months.
- Please do leave Taiwan within 90 or 30 days after your last arrival; otherwise a fine will be given as well as the visa free restriction to Taiwan for a year.
- ♦ (90 days) Andorra, Austria, Australia, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, El Salvador, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Haiti, Honduras, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Monaco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Paraguay, Poland, Portugal, Romania, San Marino, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, U.K., U.S.A. and Vatican City State.
- ♦ (30 days) Belize, Brunei, Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Malaysia, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent, Singapore, St. Kitts and Nevis, and Thailand.
- 1. If you don't plan your trip yet, applying for a **Multiple Visa** will be better.
- 2. If you don't plan to go abroad when you are in Taiwan, you just need a Single Visa and the NCCU

will provide you an immigration document for visa extension to at most 6 months for free. <u>Please</u> be notified that it is NOT possible to change a Single Visa to a Multiple one in Taiwan.

(2) Staying more than 180 days (For student who will study for one academic year):

 Please apply for <u>a Resident Visa</u>. Within 15 days upon your arrival in Taiwan, please apply for an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) in the National Immigration Agency. An immigration package will be provided by NCCU for obtaining your ARC.

7. Credits

At CNCCU 3 credits = 54 hours of in-class teaching hours. Normally, NCCU local students will take 20 credits (undergraduate), 15 for graduate, and the average credit number for exchange students is 12, in one semester. (NCCU credit: ECTS = 1:2.5-3)

8. Grading

The academic assessment methods on exchange students are frequently in the forms of class participation, attendance, examinations, quizzes, projects, assignments, case studies, and presentations for each individual course. We maintain a 100-point grading scale system as below:

9. Insurance

Students have to buy their own insurance before coming to NCCU to cover the stay in Taiwan. There is no medical insurance product provided in NCCU; however, all exchange students are required to buy the minimum student insurance (NTD 150 – around USD 5) which just cover very basic accident claim.

10. Buddy Program

The OIP provides a "buddy program", in which for every exchange student, one to two local Taiwanese voluntary students will be assigned to be his/her buddies. These local 'buddies' will assist them in any problems they may encounter, to help them adjust to the life in Taipei.
