Minimum Language Skills	<p>B2.2 (C1 or higher strongly recommended) – Please note that the language skill level is directly related to a student’s academic success. Even if students fulfil the minimum language requirement, they are advised to further improve their language skills before the beginning of their semester abroad. SRH Hochschule Berlin offers a fee-based English Pre-Study Course / Academic English class which students may attend in the summer to prepare themselves for their academic experience at SRH Hochschule Berlin.</p> <p>You only need to submit sufficient language proof for the language in which you plan to take courses at SRH Hochschule Berlin (English and/or German). The following proof may be accepted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> □ Official language test (IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge, DHS, Test DaF, etc.) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Taken within the last 24 months ✓ Confirming the equivalent of a B2.2 language level according to the CEFR for Languages ✓ Test must evaluate <u>all</u> 4 skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing □ Official letter confirming that the language of instruction of the degree program you are enrolled in at your home university is English/German □ Official confirmation of successful completion of an academic English/German language class with the following requirements (which must all be stated in the confirmation): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Must have been completed within the last 12 months ✓ Must include reading, writing, listening and speaking ✓ At least B2.2 language level (according to the CEFR for Languages) ✓ Adequate number of contact hours (minimum 40 hours)

	<p>✓ Successful completion with an equivalent of grade "B" or better (grade "B" minimum refers to a grading scale of "A" to "F" with "A" being the best grade and "F" meaning "Failed"; detailed grading scale must be provided)</p>

Capacities are limited, especially in the classes taught in English; spaces will be distributed first-come-first-served. A list with available courses will be provided shortly before each semester begins. Internship modules, thesis modules and some selected courses are <u>not</u> open to exchange students.</p>
Duration of Exchange Programme	One or two semesters (depending on agreement with the partner university)
Credits	<p>SRH Hochschule Berlin uses the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS). ECTS credits are awarded for successfully completed studies. 1 ECTS is equivalent to 25-30 hours of study.</p> <p>At SRH Hochschule Berlin the students can get 5 or 6 ECTS per course. Students have to take a minimum of one course and a maximum of 30 ECTS per semester.</p>
Grading System	At SRH Hochschule Berlin we use a grading system from 1,0 to 5,0 with 1,0 being the best grade and 5,0 being the lowest possible grade and the only failing grade. Some courses may be graded with pass / fail only.
Language classes	SRH Hochschule Berlin offers curricular and non-curricular language classes in German, English and Spanish. Curricular classes have to be stated on the learning agreement. Non-curricular language classes are not free of charge. Please note that not every level will be offered in every semester. Language classes may overlap with regular classes.
Student Housing Available on Campus	Currently not available. Once accepted, incoming exchange students receive a Student Welcome Guide with detailed information on how to find a place to stay in Berlin, as well as other relevant topics.
Cost of Living	Students should plan to spend a minimum of 700 € per month on accommodation, transportation, leisure activities and other living costs. Cost may vary tremendously depending on each individual's lifestyle.
Transportation	All students have to purchase a "semester ticket" for public transportation at the beginning of each semester from SRH Hochschule Berlin. This very discounted student ticket cost around 190 € and allows the use of the whole public transportation system in either Berlin or Dresden. The purchase is mandatory.
Visa Requirements	Students should check with the German Embassy in their home country or

Health Insurance	<p>Every student who is enrolled at a German university is required by law to purchase (at their own expense) sufficient health insurance for the entire programme duration. Students must either submit an insurance confirmation from a German health insurance provider or a waiver form from a German health insurance provider, the latter confirming that the health insurance from the home country is sufficient to fulfil all requirements of the German health care system.</p> <p>The student will not be able to enroll at SRH Hochschule Berlin (this means: no documents, no lectures, no service) if s/he does not submit proof of German health insurance coverage or a waiver form.</p>
